

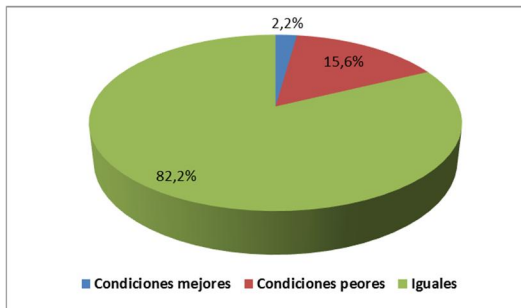

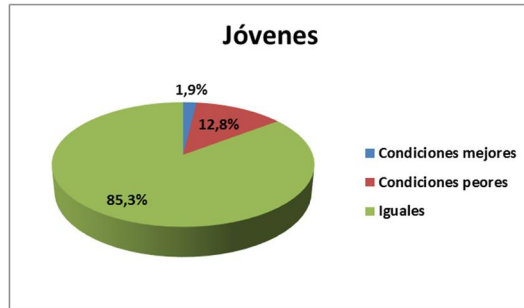
'OPINIONS IN CUBA 17 MONTHS AFTER THE REESTABLISHMENT OF RELATIONS WITH THE UNITED STATES'

1. Conditions 17 months after the reestablishment of relations USA/CUBA.

Of the survey participants, 82.2% indicated that the situation in Cuba has not changed and that the conditions and quality of life remain the same 17 months after the reestablishment of relations between the USA and Cuba. Of the young people surveyed (18 to 40 years old), 85.3% indicated that the situation in Cuba has not changed and that the conditions and quality of life remain the same 17 months after the reestablishment of relations between the USA and Cuba.

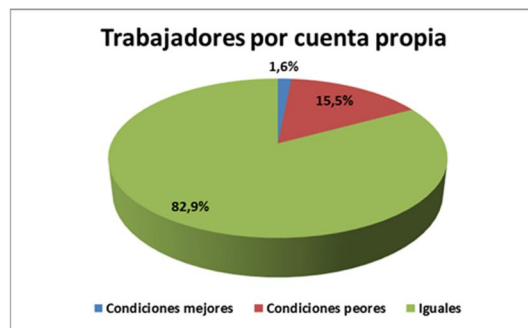


Blue Better conditions

With respect to self-employed workers (autónomos), 82.9% say the situation will not change, 15.5% say their situation has worsened, and 1.6% their situation is the same.



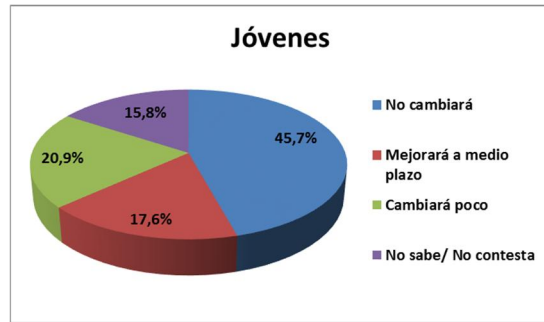
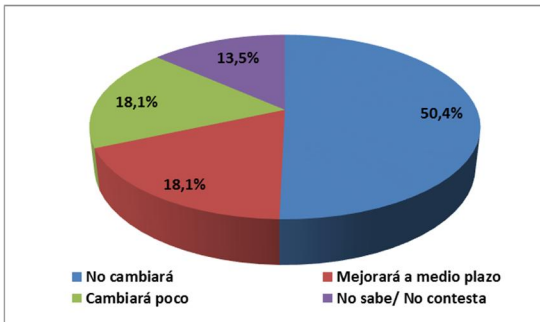
Graph title: Self-employed workers

2. Affirmations with regard to Cuba/USA relations

With regard to expectations, 50.4% of the survey participants affirmed that in spite of the thawing of relations between the USA and Cuba, the situation will not change, 18.1% believe the situation will change in a mid-term time frame, 18.1% affirm that little will change, and 13.5% are unsure/did not answer.

Of the young people surveyed, (18 to 40 years old) 45.7% affirm that the situation will not change, 20.9% believe that little will change, 17.6% indicated they believe it will change in a mid-term time frame, and 15.8% are unsure/did not answer.



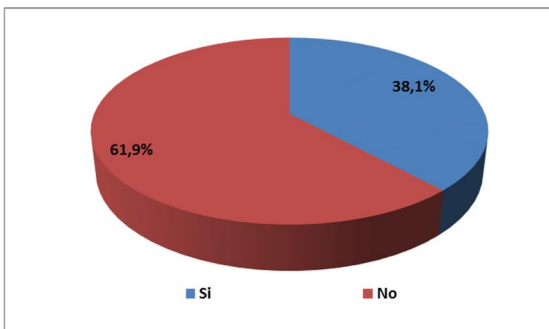
Blue: No change

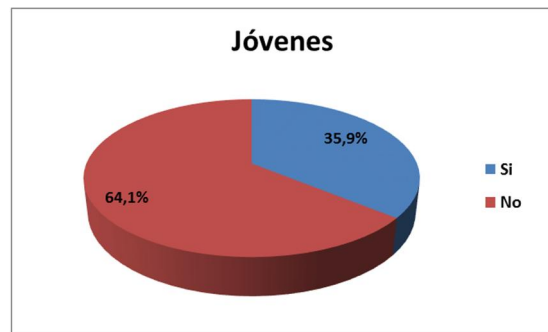


3. Do you know the results and conclusions of the PCC's VII Congress?

With regard to the PCC's VII Congress, 61.9% of the survey participants did not know the results. Of the young people surveyed, 64.1% did not know the results.

Among self-employed works who were surveyed, 56.2% did not know the results and 43.8% indicated that they did

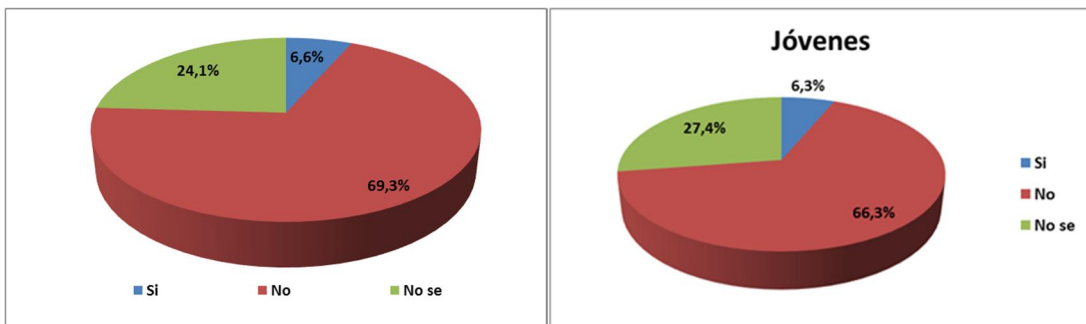

4. Do you think that your personal situation will improve following the VII Congress?

Of the survey participants, 69.3% believe their personal situation will not improve following the Congress, 24.1% are unsure/did not answer, and 6.6% believe that their situation will improve. Among the young participants (18 to 40 years old), 66.3% believe that their personal situation will not improve following the Congress, 27.4% are unsure/did not answer and 6.3% believe that their situation will improve



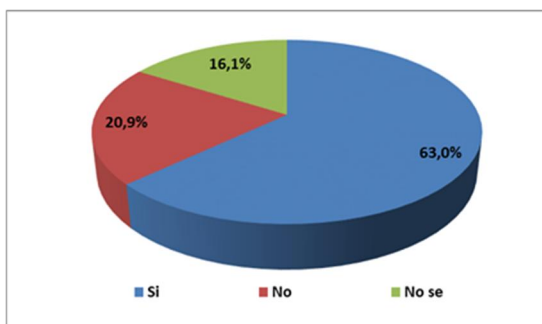

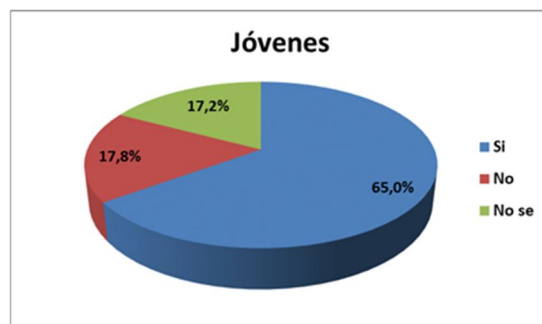


5. Will you vote in the referendum?

In the VII Congress, it was affirmed a referendum will be convened. When asked in the survey if they will vote in the referendum, 63% indicated that they would vote in the referendum, 20.9% would not vote, and 16.1% are unsure/did not answer. Of the young people (18 to 40 years old) surveyed, 65% indicated that they would vote in the referendum, 17.8% would not vote, and 17.2% are unsure/did not answer.

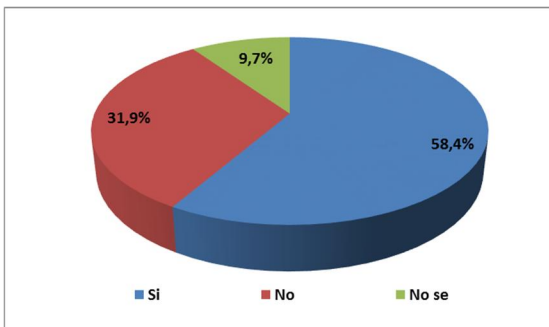

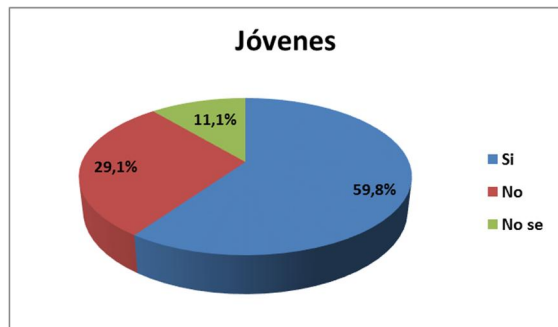


6. Do you know what human rights are?

With regard to human rights: 58.4% of the survey participants affirmed that they know what human rights are, 31.9% indicated that they do not, and 9.7% are unsure/did not answer. Of the young people (18 to 40 years old) surveyed, 59.8% affirmed that they know what human rights are, 29.1% indicated that they do not, and 11.1% are unsure/did not answer.

Green: Unsure/no answer

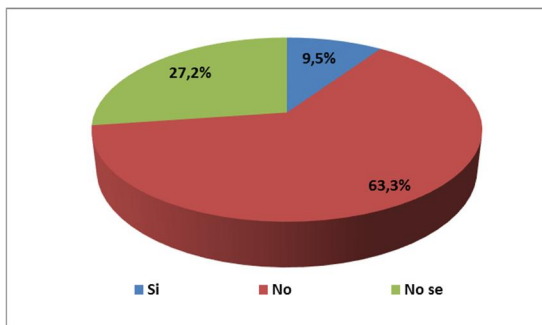

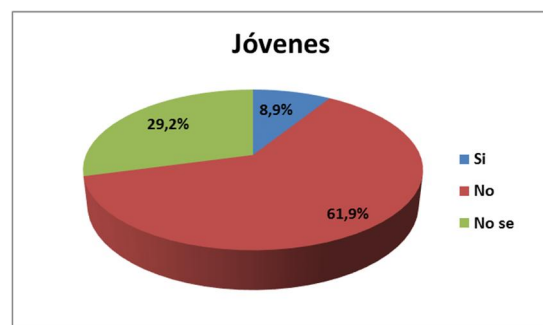


7. ¿Do you think that the government respects and takes measures to protect human rights?

In response to this question, 63.3% believe that the government does not respect human rights, 27.2% are unsure/did not answer, and 9.5% believe that the government respects human rights. Of the young people (18 to 40 years old) surveyed, 61.9% believe that the government does not respect human rights, 29.2% are unsure/did not answer and 8.9% believe that the government respects human rights.

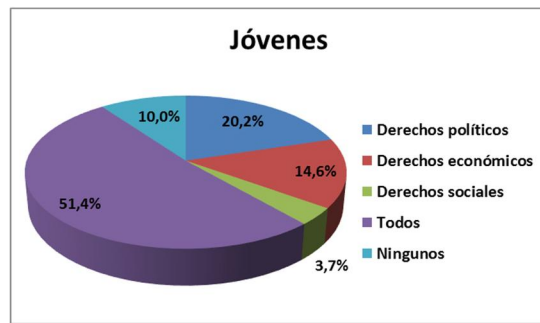
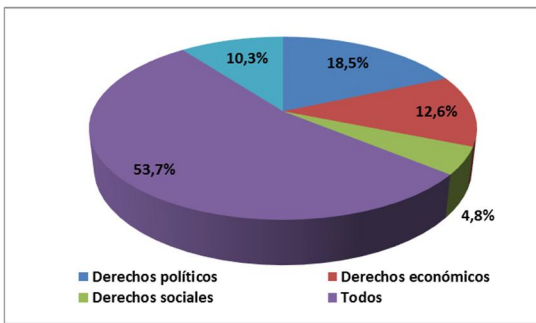

8. Which of the following human rights do you think are violated?

For 53.7% of the population surveyed, all human rights are violated; another 18.5% consider that political rights are the most violated, 12.6% consider that economic rights are the most violated, 4.8% consider that social rights are the most violated, 10.3% does not believe that any human right is violated in Cuba. Of the young people (18 to 40 years old) surveyed, 51.4% consider that all human rights are violated in Cuba; another 20.2% consider that political rights are the most violated, 14.6% consider that economic rights are the most violated, 3.7% consider that social rights are the most violated, and 10% does not believe that any human right is violated in Cuba.



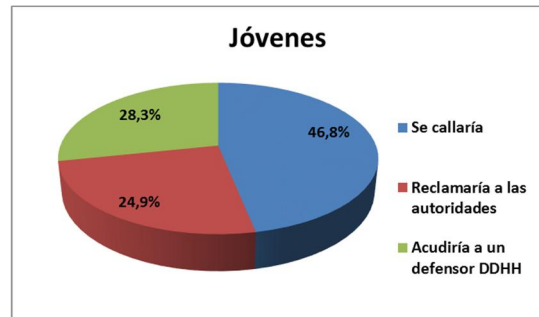
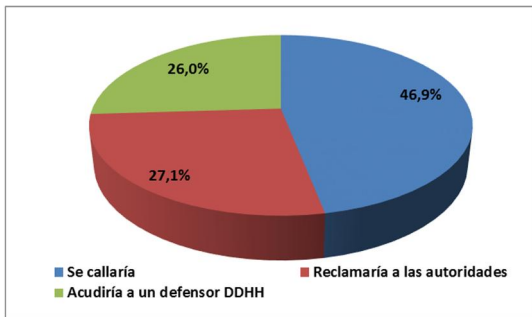
Blue: Political rights

9. What you would you do if one of your human rights were violated?

Faced with the violation of one of their human rights, 46.9% of survey participants said that would remain quiet, while 26% would approach a human rights defender, and 27.1% would report it to the authorities. Among the young people (18 to 40 years old) surveyed, 46.8% said that they would remain quiet, while 28.3% would approach a human rights defender, and 24.9% would report it to the authorities.



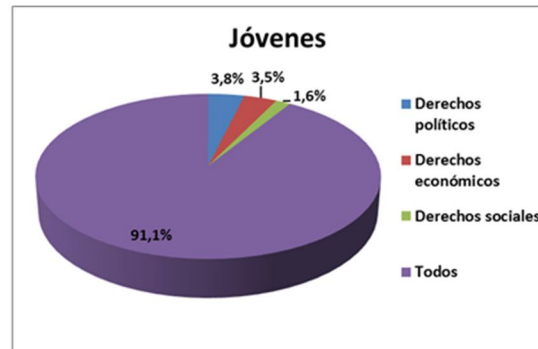
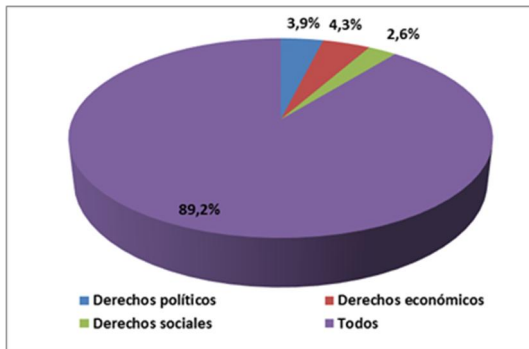
Blue: Remain quiet

For 89.2% of the survey population and 91.1% of the young people (18 to 40 years old) surveyed, all human rights are important

METHODOLOGY

The information was obtained through field work in which participants were interviewed using a survey. To guarantee a random and representative cohort, we randomly selected the participants. The survey was carried out across the country, with both male and female participants, aged 18 to 70+. The sample size of 1,100 survey participants came from survey points in the following provinces: La Habana, Oriente and Camagüey, which are representative of the three large geographic regions of Cuba. The margin of error for the survey is 5% and the level of confidence is 95%.

The field work was executed during the month of June. It was coordinated across the island by 3 people and a total of 15 people, all Cuban, carried out the surveys.

Once the field work was completed, the data were sent to Madrid digitally (the individual surveys were sent one by one). Once received in Madrid, the local communication firm Carpe Diem Publicidad cleaned, processed, and analyzed the data.

Carpe Diem Publicidad is an advertising agency in Madrid which specializes in database management, with more than 10 years of experience in traditional and digital direct marketing, product information campaigns, and services for public and private entities, including electoral campaigns for several national political parties.

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
